Within the framework of the **EU Erasmus+ Programme**, the **Anti Match-Fixing Top Training (AMATT)** project proposes specialized training to enhance sport bodies capacity and to promote qualified media engagement in the fight against match-fixing and the influence of organized crime in the Sport World.

Match-fixing is currently one of the major scourges of contemporary sport. It undermines sport’s integrity and credibility, destroying its core values and the important social and economic role performed by Sport since ancient times.

The Council of Europe Convention on the Manipulation of Sport Competitions (2014), UN UNCAC Resolutions 7/8 (2017) and 73/190 (2018) on Sport and Corruption, and UNESCO Kazan Action Plan, clearly demonstrate the relevance of this threat, as well the need for actions and policies able to fight it efficiently.

In recent years, an increasing number of sport bodies, state authorities, research institutions, non-profit organizations, were involved in multiple and very diverse initiatives aimed to prevent and fight match-fixing at the national, regional and international levels. Thanks to that, we now have a more structured set of anti-match-fixing tools and strategies, but, nevertheless, match-fixing and illegal betting seem somehow unstoppable if we don’t continue to work closely together, coordinating efforts and strengthening a common understanding of the main challenges we face.

The **AMATT International Conference** will provide a unique knowledge-sharing opportunity for key stakeholders at the European level. During this half-day event, participants and speakers from different Member-States will potentiate critical thinking and exchange a wide range of best practices and know-how aimed to enhancing sport bodies capacity and promoting qualified media engagement.
